welcomes all in celebration of the immigrant experience, and graces public space with design features to engage all ages to come together on common ground.

The **Abstract Sculpture**, a split rhomboid dodecahedron, is symbolic of the immigrant experience. Annually, the Abstract Sculpture is reconfigured, symbolic of all who pulled away from their country of origin and came to these Massachusetts shores, establishing themselves in new and different ways, contributing to the richness of American life and culture.

In early Spring, a crane lifts and pulls apart the two halves of Abstract Sculpture, made of steel and aluminum, to create a new sculptural shape.

The Abstract Sculpture sits atop a **Reflecting Pool**. The Sculpture is dedicated to lives lost during the Armenian Genocide of 1915–1923 and all genocides that have followed.

The water of the Reflecting Pool washes over its side and re-emerges as a single jet of water at the Labyrinth's center, representing hope and rebirth.

The **Labyrinth**, a circular winding path paved in grass and inlaid stone, celebrates life's journey. *Art, Service, Science, Commerce* are etched around its circle in tribute to contributions made to American life and culture.

At the crossroads of resident, business and tourist footpaths, the Park is between Faneuil Hall Marketplace and Christopher Columbus Park.
